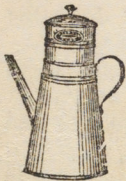

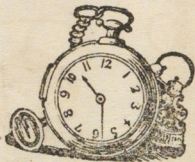

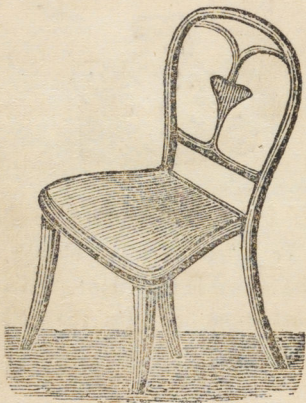

A VERY LITTLE SONG.

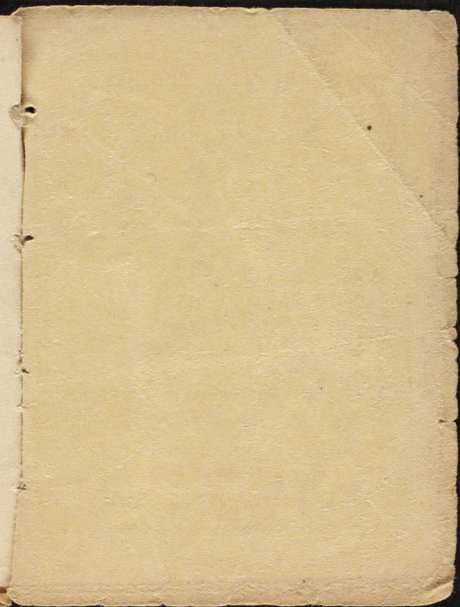
VERY little things are we,
